They've spent many hours researching, trying out techniques and planning the designs, which are almost complete. 50 adults and 81 children have been involved in the project and we can't wait to unveil the finished panels at HOPE's new home in 2026.

We will be working with Professor Peter Anderson from the University of Leeds in the Spring, learning skills and ethics to undertake our own audio interviews and creating an exhibition of the work.
